made a few changes to the procedure and content of the welcome, and some slight changes to timing of the readers' approach to the altar and in the pause at the end of each reading.

We have been a little stretched for resources lately, as personal and family circumstances have resulted in some readers not wishing to commit for some weeks ahead. However we managed to cover Holy Week and I am currently managing the rota in effect a few weeks at a time. I will approach new people if I think they may be able to help, and also hope we will repeat the Volunteering Sunday this year.

St Peter's Hospitality Team Report April 2018

The Hospitality Team has welcomed new members Jacky Carter and Di Buchanan, while Lucy Eggins has had to stand down temporarily while she has a planned operation. in the Eco-Parish spirit, we have upgraded our provision of disposable cups to "vegware", which is biodegradable and compostable. Hot drinks and biscuits continue to be provided every Sunday in term time, along with home baking most Sundays, with more elaborate catering for special occasions, eg:
