# St Columba's and St Peter's, Edinburgh Third Sunday of Advent —Year C 15—22 December 2024

The third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday, 'gaudete' means rejoice. There is a clear note of joy in today's liturgy. The basis of our joy is the nearness of the Lord.

As we gather to celebrate the Eucharist the Lord is very near us. Indeed, he is in our midst. Lord Jesus, you turn our sorrow into joy. You turn our fear into trust. You turn despair into hope.

The theme of the nearness of the Lord is also at the heart of the gospel.

John the Baptist tells the people what they must do in order to prepare for the Lord's coming and to escape his searching judgement. At the same time he makes it clear that he is subordinate to Jesus.

# Canon Kenneth writes ...

Gaudete Sunday is the third Sunday of Advent in the Western Christian liturgical calendar, and is a day to celebrate joy and anticipation for Christmas:

- Name: The name comes from the Latin word gaudete, which means "rejoice".
- Date: Gaudete Sunday can fall on any date between December 11 and 17.
- Focus: The focus of Advent shifts from "The Lord is coming" to "The Lord is near" on Gaudete Sunday.
- **Tone**: The tone of Advent lightens, with a heightened sense of joyous anticipation.
- **Readings**: Readings focus on rejoicing in the Lord, and the mission of St. John the Baptist.
- Introit: The Introit "Gaudete in Domino semper" gives the day its name.
- **Symbolism**: The third candle on the Advent wreath is lit on Gaudete Sunday, representing joy.
- Tradition: Traditions surrounding Gaudete Sunday date back to the fourth or fifth century



# Christian contributions to peace in the Holy Land

His Eminence Cardinal Pizzaballa, Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem

During his recent visit to Scotland, hosted by the Scottish Lieutenancy of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre, Patriarch Pizzaballa gave an informative address to a packed audience at the Gillis Centre on the situation in the Holy Land, the prospects for peace, and how Christians can contribute to peace and healing.

The Patriarch outlined the contrasting perspectives of Israelis and Palestinians regarding the current conflict, and described the desperate humanitarian situation in Gaza, the stark economic and societal impact on the West Bank, and the fear felt by the Israelis.

He explained that although this armed conflict will come to an end, political and social conflict will continue and a true peace requires justice, healing and forgiveness.

He showed how Christians are contributing to that hope for true peace even now – with mosques and churches in Gaza co-operating at grass-roots level, with the tiny Christian Palestinian population of 1% enabling meetings between Jews and Muslims, and with the Catholic Church entrusted to deliver vital aid supplies in north Gaza.

### And he asked us to do 3 things:

- to support the Christian community and fraternity between the communities by bravely coming on pilgrimage again as soon as the armed conflict ends
- 2. to pray for peace
- and to be channels of peace, promoting justice, forgiveness and healing.

# The 'O' Antiphons

The importance of O Antiphons is twofold:

Each one highlights a title for the Messiah:

- O Sapientia (O Wisdom),
- O Adonai (O Lord),
- O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse)
- O Clavis David (O Key of David)
- O Oriens (O Rising Sun)
- O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations), and
- O Emmanuel

An antiphon is a short verse that is used like a refrain, either repeated at points through another text or to begin and end it. Antiphons are often used in Christian worship, for example, during the singing of psalms.

It is also traditional for the Gospel Canticle at Morning, Evening and Night Prayer to have an antiphon said or sung at the beginning and the end. The Gospel canticle at Evening Prayer (also known as Vespers or Evensong) is the Magnificat, the Song of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Luke 1.46-55).

The 'O Antiphons' are the antiphons that are said or sung before and after the Magnificat on the seven days preceding Christmas Eve (17–23 December). They all begin 'O...' hence their name. They are known by their Latin titles, for example, 'O Sapientia...', is 'O Wisdom...'

The antiphons use texts from the Bible, both Old and New Testament, that Christians understand to refer to Jesus Christ, the coming Messiah. People who do not know the antiphons from Evening Prayer may well know them from the Advent hymn 'O come, O come, Emmanuel'.
