
Want to know how to hear God's voice more clearly?

St Columba's and St Peter's, Edinburgh 28th Sunday of the Year — Year C 12—19 October 2025

It is presumed that the other nine were Jews. The stranger puts the Jews to shame. The reaction of the Samaritan anticipates the glad reception of the good news by the Samaritan in acts 8: 1-25. Canon Kenneth writes ...

There is turmoil in our world today. We need to intensify our efforts at prayer to overcome the limitations of this world. It is to God that we need to look afresh to find ways of working for justice and helping peoples and nations to live together.

- The scourge of war is very much to the forefront at the present time. We need peacemakers that can find new ways of living together.
- There is much political unrest in many parts of the world. We need new and innovative ways of bringing our communities together.
- We need to take this moment as an invitation to share the power of the gospel with the wider world so as to find new solutions to inequality and selfishness.

The Jubilee Year requires making a choice: serving God and justice or money and inequity, Pope Leo XIV said, marking the Jubilee of Migrants and the Jubilee of the Missions. "We pray to be a church that does not serve money or itself, but the kingdom of God and his justice," he said during a special audience in St. Peter's Square 4 October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. It was the same day that the pope also signed his first apostolic exhortation, "Dilexi Te" ("I Have Loved You"), which will be released 9 October.

Fabric Update

St Columba's Halls: this week the newly painted radiators were re-installed in the Main hall and work there is nearing an end. The painters next will move to the stairwell.

St Peter's sanctuary: by the end of October the main sanctuary field and two sides of it will be cladded with stone. The electricians will begin the new lighting at the beginning of November. Soon the new ambo will be in place, followed by the altar. Then the apse and Blessed Sacrament pedestal will be complete by the beginning of December.

Archbishop Leo Cushley has agreed to come to consecrate the altar on Saturday 21 February 2026 at 5.30pm Mass.

The Caretakers Flat: permission has been received from the Trustees of the diocese to go ahead with the renovation of the flat. We have applied to the city of Edinburgh for a Building Warrant and as soon as that is granted work will begin.

Learning about St. Kenneth

The feast of St Kenneth is 11 October and is celebrated in the Diocese of Argyle and the Isles. St Kenneth, Abbot. AD 599.

With St. Columba, Sr. Bridget and St. Maelrubba, St. Kenneth ranks among the most popular of the Irish saints honoured in Scotland.

He was the child of poor Irish parents, and was employed during his early years in tending sheep. When he attained the years of manhood he became a monk, and passed over to Wales, where he became the disciple In Scotland this saint had many dedications: of the renown St Cadoc. He was one of that Saint's most beloved followers on account of his perfect obedience. •

After being ordained a Priest he made a pilgrimage to Rome, and returning to Ireland became a disciple of St. Mobbi and St. Finnian. St. Columba, St. Comgall and St. Kiaran lived with him as members of the same community.

Later on St. Kenneth visited Scotland where he lived as monk. He is believed to have founded a monastery at St. Andrews and to have built churches in other parts of the A Calendar of Scottish Saints, Abbey Press, Fort country, converting many by the fervor of his preaching. Augustus, 1919

He spent time with St. Columba at Iona, and accompanied that Saint in his visit to King Brude at Inverness, and it was St. Kenneth who, with the sign of the cross, caused the King's hand to wither, when he drew his word against the missionaries.

St. Kenneth died in Ireland. He founded the monastery at Aghaboe, and around it grew up the town of that name, which in the twelfth century was the seat of the Bishops of Ossory, who residence was later transferred to

- Kilchenzie, in Kintyre
- Kilkenneth, in Tiree
- Kilchainnech, in Iona
- Kilchainie, in South Uist
- Laggan in Inverness-shire, and others

The great abbey of Cambuskenneth takes its name from him, as well as Chenzie Island in the river of Islay and Kennoway (anciently Kennochi) in Fifeshire.

Reflection

I used to think gratitude a heavy burden for one to carry. Now I know that it is something that makes the heart lighter. The ungrateful person seems to me to be one who walks with feet and heart of lead. But when one has learned, however inadequately, what a lovely thing gratitude is, ones feet go lightly over sand and sea, and one finds a strange joy revealed to one, the joy of counting up, not what one possesses but what one owes.
